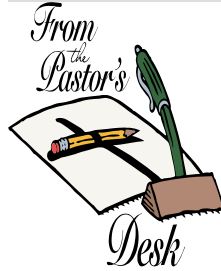

Pastor's Message



Dear Friends,

Have you ever heard or said, "Knock on Wood"? The phrase is considered a superstition. People use this phrase (and the action it describes) to hopefully prevent bad luck. For instance, you may be discussing a particular negative event experienced by someone else and you may say, "It's never happened to me, knock on wood." Then, you would look around for a solid wooden surface or object to rap your knuckles on – which is increasingly hard to find in our world of plastic and pressboard. You may also use

the phrase if you are wishful that something would happen. For instance, you may be making plans for a trip this weekend, while telling someone your plans you may end the phrase with "knock on wood" to help everything that needs to fall into place happen thus enabling your trip. I always get a kick out of it when someone knocks on their own head while saying "knock on wood" - that never gets old!

The exact origin is unknown but we do know a number of things about the history behind, and the global use of, the phrase. The ancient Greeks worshipped the oak as it was sacred to Zeus, Celts believed in tree spirits, and both believed that touching sacred trees would bring good fortune. Irish lore holds that "touching wood" is a way to thank the leprechauns for a bit of luck. Pagans also held similar beliefs of protective tree spirits. Chinese and Koreans thought the spirits of mothers who died in childbirth remained in nearby trees. In Spain, they "touch wood" whenever an event happens that is thought to bring bad luck. In medieval England, one "touched wood" in order to have a private conversation so the tree spirits would neither overhear nor interfere. So, the phrase "touch wood" predates "knock on wood". Both phrases, however, were predated by a Latin version: "*absit omen*" - which originates as far back as the 1400's and means "far be that omen from us." A Jewish version also traces the origin of "knocking on wood" to the Spanish Inquisition of the 15th century. At the time, persecuted Jews fled to synagogues built of wood, and they devised a coded knock to gain admission. Since this practice spared countless lives, it became common to "knock on wood" for good luck.

Like many other pagan and religious practices that were pre-existing, Christianity took and adapted the phrase to refer to the life of prayer and devotion. The phrase was used by Christians as they prayed using their rosary beads (made of wood, usually oak) as they petitioned their Heavenly Father. The phrase "knocking on wood" also referred to the practice when the prayer beads were fingered in times of distress and trouble. The Christian cross became a sign of "good luck" and holding or rubbing a wooden crucifix when danger was near also became a common way for Christians to deal with difficulty – hence "knocking on wood". I'm not particularly superstitious as long as I avoid stepping on cracks, putting the toilet paper on the wrong way, or picking up pennies with the tail side up! Still, prayer beads and crucifixes are not some magical way either to fix or ward off anything in my opinion. They simply are tools to help me focus and remember to make God a priority in my life. After all, isn't that what God did for all of us?

OPERATIONS TEAM

The Operations Team has been busy with a number of projects in the past month. Among them have been:

1. The critters in our Education wing have been eradicated and the building has been deodorized.
2. Recycling the old heavy 8 foot tables for new plastic ones.
3. **Service1st** has been contracted to maintain our air conditioning system.
4. The Church was pressure-washed on July 18th.
5. We are gathering bids to build closets/cabinets on the east wall of the Sanctuary.
6. **Better Barricades** has given a bid on curbing (to be done at a later date).
7. We had a Clean-Up Day on Saturday, July 21st to spread mulch, trim bushes and clean-up around the property. *Bob Gaither*

WEST PROPERTY UPDATE: On Monday July 9th, Pastor Bill, Sher Buller, Tracy Davis, Bob Gaither, Reid Hughes, Joe Thompson and Lauren Tromley met to discuss the development of the property. The following items were discussed and consensus reached as to:

1. The projects would entail minimal development—both to keep costs down and to reflect the theology of environmentalism we want to embrace.
2. The tree trimmer we used recently would be employed to remove dead trees and vines in August.
3. We would need to have the area raked and graded for any work to be done.
4. We need to place a footbridge across the drainage spillway.
5. We need to build a cement pad and pavilion with new service for lights and power.
6. We are looking at implementing most of the work in September/October time frame.

A WORD ABOUT THE UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST

Bob and Kay Russell sent Pastor Bill a piece about our denomination by Bishop John Spong:

A Salute to the United Church of Christ

July 26, 2012

Sometimes, as one goes about the normal duties of one's professional life, a pattern of activity slowly becomes visible until one wonders why this had not been seen before. When that happens, it is good to stop, to notice, to put the pieces together, to seek to understand and then to formulate the new insight so that it can become common knowledge.

This was my experience in the first part of this year when I was invited to a number of churches in what might be called the heartland of America. In every incidence, the church to which I was asked to deliver lectures stood out in its community like a beacon of light. It was always the church in that community that engaged the issues of the day. It was the congregation in that community that encouraged people to think and to study. It was a church more interested in genuine education than it was in ecclesiastical propaganda. It was a congregation willing to be controversial, willing to stand up for truth in the public marketplace. It was a church that did not require that the brains of its people be checked at the door prior to worship. It was a congregation whose members cared about their world, their community, themselves and their pastor. These churches also projected vitality and they were all growing. The revelation that ultimately emerged, however, was that each one of these congregations was a part of the United Church of Christ-Congregational denomination. This fact was so consistent that I concluded it could not be just a coincidence and that something about the United Church of Christ must be at least in part responsible and so my appreciation for this denomination soared.

Perhaps, I thought, this church can be the one Christian denomination that will inspire, bring about and participate in the necessary reformation required to break the Christian faith out of its dying patterns, it's no longer believable theological understandings and its medieval worship practices. Maybe this can be the church that will break the traditional Christian paradigm based on human depravity and transform it to a paradigm based on human wholeness. Until these aspects of Christianity are faced, engaged and changed, there is, I believe, little realistic hope for a Christian future...

So to these churches and to the leadership of the National United Church of Christ, I first raise my hand in salute for your courage and your dedication. Second, I stand before you in awe for what you have meant in my life and in the life of Christianity itself. Third, I bow my head and my heart in thanksgiving for your witness to the Truth.

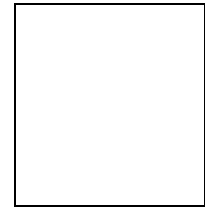

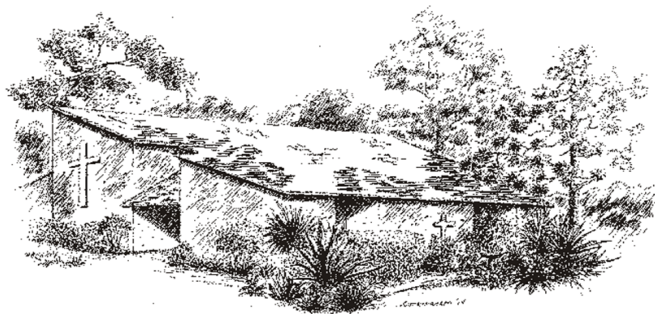
