Expenses are up most in the areas of insurance and building maintenance. Although we may not end the year as well as what was budgeted, we are still in better shape than previous years.

From time to time it becomes necessary to adjust expenses up and down or to reallocate funds based on changing needs. All this is done through careful review and approval by the Church Council. Incredible Food

Downeast Maine Pumpkin **Bread**

"This is a great old Maine recipe, moist and spicy. The bread actually tastes even better the day after it is baked. Great for holiday gift giving!"

Original Recipe Yield 3 - 7x3 inch loaf pans

Ingredients

- 1 (15 ounce) can pumpkin puree
- 4 eggs


- 1 cup vegetable oil 2/3 cup water 3 cups white sugar 3 1/2 cups all-purpose
- 2 teaspoons baking
- soda i 1 1/2 teaspoons salt

- 1 teaspoon ground cin-
- 1 teaspoon ground nut-
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease and flour three 7x3 inch loaf
- 2. In a large bowl, mix together pumpkin puree, eggs, oil, water and sugar until well blended. In a separate bowl, whisk together the flour, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg, cloves and ginger. Stir the dry ingredients into the pumpkin mixture until iust blended. Pour into the prepared pans.
- 3. Bake for about 50 minutes in the preheated oven. Loaves are done when toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.


ABOUT MEMBERS & FRIENDS




