OPERATIONS TEAM



Your Operations Team continues to be busy, as you hopefully have noticed, by opening up a new doorway into our sanctuary from the Jim Reed room. The reason for this is to help eliminate the congestion that seems to happen between services and events we have in the Sanctuary upon other occasions.

We are also asking that there be a little more space between the back row of our chairs and the new sound system area. That area is really congested if seats are moved back from where they are found. Please resist the temptation to get further away from Pastor Bill during our service. Makes him feel bad.

The Deacons closet has now been moved to the two closet doors near Pastor Bill's office.

Something most of you don't see is added shelving in the attic space over the office, which has been badly needed and is now much more efficient.

We've had some water usage problems with some toilets that have not quite shut off after a flush and three toilets have new flappers that have fixed the problem. One of our urinals in the men's room has been fixed as well. Port Orange water is expensive and we need NOT to have leaks or faucets left on in the bathrooms. That has happened upon occasion.

Operations negotiated with the city of Port Orange when we had a VERY large monthly water bill (way out of our normal) to see if that could be reduced. It was reduced but we were told that would be a one time offer.

Operations needs ALL of your eyes looking around to help us. If any of you ever see anything concerning the physical structure of our church that seems askew please TELL someone in Operations or any other leadership member and we will address it quickly. Also, due to insurance regulation and liability issues, we can no longer permit use of our parking lot by non-members for non-church events.

Lastly, our church owes the Florida Conference Dues the first of each year. The dues for 2013 are \$14.50 per each family member and the envelope can be found in your yearly offering envelope boxes.



Second Word Luke 23: 39-43 "Presence" February 17 First Sunday

Jesus spoke to the thief who was being crucified next to Him."Truly I say to you, today you shall be with me in paradise." Luke 23:43

Third Word John 19: 25b-27 "Your Son" February 24 Second Sunday

Jesus spoke to His mother Mary and John who were standing together nearby. To his mother: "Dear woman, behold, your son!" To his disciple: "Behold, your mother!" And from that day forward, John took Mary into his home as his own mother. John 19:26-27

Fourth Word Matthew 27: 45-47 "Forsaken" March 3 Third Sunday

WEST PROPERTY UPDATE

As you all can see, the Root Party in December was a huge success. The grass is growing, the storm sewer grate has been replaced and thanks in large part to Ric Pountain, the brush has been cleared from the rear of the property. The West Property Team met on January 20th and reviewed plans for Phase I of the construction planned.



A 24 foot by 24 foot area has been flagged off on the smaller portion of the property nearer the church and before the drainage swale. The decision has been to develop that area first because it is smaller, closer to the existing church buildings, and more user friendly for access and immediate usage. We have received bids on a concrete pad and steel roofed pavilion structure to erect on that site as soon as adequate funds are raised. We will begin focusing our efforts on raising the needed funds beginning in March. Be thinking and praying about how you can help make this dream become a reality. Our goal is to have the structure up and available by the end of summer. **Stay Tuned!**

SOUND SYSTEM UPDATE



Nate Mudge and NATECO completed the initial installation of our new sound and video projection systems on Saturday, January 19th and our first trial was in worship on the 20th. The systems worked great and everyone was delighted and surprised at the amazing clarity of the

new sound system and the power of video projection for readings and videos. Thanks to Billy Wiggins and his crew from Economy Electric for their help with this project. Two additional items with reference to these wonderful new resources:

<u>First</u>, we still need to purchase a computer and specific software to use with our projection system – we borrowed Nate's for the 20th. The costs will be \$599 for the computer and \$389 for the MediaShout program. If anyone wants to make a needed contribution to finish this project, please call Pastor Bill!

<u>Second</u>, a general Training session will be held on *Saturday February 2nd at 10:00 AM* for leaders and servants to learn more about the systems and how to use them. That being said, no one is to turn on or use the systems without prior permission from Pastor Bill and the Deacons.


