- 2. I wish I didn't work so hard.

- 3. I wish I'd had the courage to express my feelings.

- 5. I wish that I had let myself be happier.

I believe that being true ourselves and living as God's children and disciples of Jesus Christ will cause us to value our priorities, find time for ourselves and others, and ultimately help us to find joy and contentment in this life. Still, not a bad list to consider as we cross the threshold into a New Year!

ABOUT PALMETTO HOUSE

Palmetto House, with its forty-eight rooms, is the largest temporary housing facility in Volusia and Flagler Counties. Its purpose is to facilitate the movement of homeless families and individuals to permanent housing within a reasonable amount of time (usually 24 months). Temporary housing is primarily designed to serve homeless families with children and individuals in accordance with HUD's Office of Community Planning and Development (CPD) programs or functions. Supportive services provided to clients are case management, goal setting, counseling, life skills, alcohol/drug abuse services, mental health service referrals, other related

health services referrals, Embassy of Hope assistance, Adult Basic Education, GED, HUD Certified Credit Counseling, Money Management workshop, Small Business Development classes, and permanent housing assistance. Drug screening is mandatory prior to entry and random thereafter. Participants must comply with strict house rules and make progress in meeting their established goals.

POUCC supports Palmetto House by providing items donated through the Thrift Store such as clothing, towels, travel bags, luggage, etc. Other such as toiletries are collected at various times throughout the year. POUCC also serves meals on various days during the month and assists with maintenance of the building when needed.

The Missions Team is in need of more people who would like to serve meals or assist with house maintenance. Please speak to any member of the Missions Team or contact our Church Office.



Incredible Food

Prime Rib with Horseradish Cream

"I love prime rib but it is so expensive when eating out. This do-it-yourself recipe will have everyone coming home with mouths watering...fast."

Ingredients

- 1 bone-in beef rib roast (6 to 8 pounds)
- 3 garlic cloves, sliced
- 1 teaspoon *pepper*
- HORSERADISH CREAM:
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream
- 2 tablespoons *prepared horse-radish*
- 2 teaspoons red wine vinegar
- 1 teaspoon *ground mustard*
- 1/4 teaspoon *sugar*
- 1/8 teaspoon *salt*
- Dash of pepper

Directions

- Place roast fat side up in a shallow roasting pan. Cut slits into roast; insert garlic slices. Sprinkle with pepper. Bake, uncovered, at 450° for 15 minutes. Reduce heat to 325°; bake 2-3/4 to 3-1/4 hours longer or until meat reaches desired doneness (for mediumrare, a meat thermometer should read 145°; medium, 160°; well-done, 170°).
- Meanwhile, in a small bowl, beat cream until soft peaks form. Fold in the horseradish, vinegar, mustard, sugar, salt and pepper. Cover and refrigerate for 1 hour.
- Remove roast to a serving platter and keep warm; let stand for 15 minutes. Serve with cream.
- Yield: 12 servings (1-1/2 cups cream).
