Pastor's Message

Dear Friends.

Now that Easter is behind us and the leftover eggs have been eaten (along with the chocolate bunnies!) and we settle down into "ordinary time" in the church calendar year, what now? How do we live as Easter people? How do we live "by HOPE" ("Helping Other People Endure") as I shared on Easter Sunday? Jack Canfield (of *Chicken Soup for the Soul* fame) is a successful motivational speaker, author, and consultant. I came across a list he shared and will present it to you over the next three months in the interest of helping us not "be happy" but be in a better position to make a difference for God by getting our problems (namely us!) out of the way – or at least reduce our capacity to be self-destructive. Here are the first five:

15 Things You Should Give Up To Be Happy

- 1. Give up your need to always be right. There are so many of us who can't stand the idea of being wrong wanting to always be right even at the risk of ending great relationships or causing a great deal of stress and pain, for us and for others. It's just not worth it. Whenever you feel the 'urgent' need to jump into a fight over who is right and who is wrong, ask yourself this question: "Would I rather be right, or would I rather be kind?" Wayne Dyer. What difference will that make? Is your ego really that big?
- **2. Give up your need for control.** Be willing to give up your need to always control everything that happens to you and around you situations, events, people, etc. Whether they are loved ones, coworkers, or just strangers you meet on the street just allow them to be. Allow everything and everyone to be just as they are and you will see how much better that will make you feel. "By letting it go it all gets done. The world is won by those who let it go, but when you try and try, the world is beyond winning." Lao Tzu
- **3.** Give up on blame. Give up on your need to blame others for what you have or don't have, for what you feel or don't feel. Stop giving your powers away and start taking responsibility for your life.
- **4. Give up your self-defeating self-talk.** Oh my. How many people are hurting themselves because of their negative, polluted and repetitive self-defeating mindset? Don't believe everything that your mind is telling you especially if it's negative and self-defeating. You are better than that. "The mind is a superb instrument if used rightly. Used wrongly, however, it becomes very destructive." Eckhart Tolle
- 5. Give up your limiting beliefs about what you can or cannot do, about what is possible or impossible. From now on, you are no longer going to allow your limiting beliefs to keep you stuck in the wrong place. Spread your wings and fly! "A belief is not an idea held by the mind, it is an idea that holds the mind" Elly Roselle

The Thrift Store has an all time record high in earnings for the first quarter of this year. We also had less than anticipated expenses which is always a wonderful bonus. Thanks to everyone for their love and support of our wonderful church. We are definitely on the right course.

OPERATIONS TEAM

The following initiatives from Operations have been approved by the Council at their April meeting:

- 1. The replacement of two toilets in the sanctuary restrooms with newer higher stools
- 2. The removal of the old water heater (no longer used) to reclaim closet storage in the sanctuary
- 3. The retrofitting of existing fluorescent light fixtures and ballasts for the new 32 watt bulbs in our buildings for a bid up to \$1,500 with Economy Electrical and Bill Wiggins
- 4. The updating of the six main sanctuary lights to dimmable CFLs to increase brilliance and reduce electricity costs for a bid up to \$1,100 with Jeff Wise Construction
- 5. To change insurance carriers saving the church some \$5,000 annually continuing comparable coverage and deductions
- 6. To change lawn care providers saving us some \$3,000 annually

Pentecost

Raymond Hargrove sent us this thought: This excerpt is from church consultant, author and UCC minister Tony Robinson's webpage: In the April 18, 2012 Christian Century Bill McKinney reviewed a host of recent studies/ reports on church life and trends. Here's a significant paragraph. "Several attributes of the internal life of congregations are strongly associated with growth in worship attendance. There traits are: a clear sense of the congregation's mission and purpose; a sense that the congregation is spiritual vital and alive; a sense that the church is 'a moral beacon in our community'; and a willingness to meet new challenges. Serious internal conflict is a very strong predictor of congregational decline. Note that last line. In most respects the conflict/ decline correlation a no-brainer, and yet in congregation after congregation I encounter some people who are much more committed to being in conflict over whatever than they are committed to the mission or purpose of the church and hence to its health and vitality. Why is that? Well, sometimes there are real issues that need to be acknowledged and resolved. But often this conflictual bent is a way individuals and groups make themselves feel important. They would rather they are listened to in the shrinking life of their church than that the church's vital witness, as a healthy and vital congregation, is heard in the wider community. In other words, in chronic conflict there is a hard core of selfishness."

THE CARD MINISTRY OF POUCC



There was a very active Women's Fellowship in the early years of the church. They did many things to support the needs of this growing church. One of the women, Doris Hartley, did not have a car, so she couldn't visit folks when there was a need. She sent cards to folks who were ill or shut-in and she soon expanded her ministry to include celebrations such as Birthdays, Anniversaries, etc. I remember one Sunday when our Pastor

asked if anyone in the congregation had any questions and someone said "Who is Doris Hartley, I received cards from her and I don't even know her." Doris was introduced to the congregation and many clapped as they had been recipients of cards from her.

That was the beginning of the Card Ministry. Since that time the following people have taken on this role: Mary Henderson, Martha Mason and Sue Batturs. Mary Henderson took it on twice when there was a need, other folks "fill in" when needed.

Before we had a Thrift Store, the "card person" bought the cards, several of us would donate funds to them, as well as the Women's Fellowship would provide cards. Today, folks donate cards to the Thrift Store and the current person doing the Card Ministry may take whatever cards they can use. Also, stamps are provided through the Church Office when needed. So for 25 years most of us have received a card for our Birthday, Anniversary or when we were ill or "under the weather" and we always knew that our church was praying for us through the cards we received. *Jeanette Campbell*

Special thanks to Betty Heffner, Russ Karel, Bob Brewster and my husband for planting, weeding, sprinkler repairs, mulching and other improvements on the Church grounds. There is always a need for others to help in this area.

Thank you to Harriet Rogers and Sonnie & Ron Zinke who have stepped up to take on coleadership roles/duties within the Thrift Store. What a wonderful start to the year! Total sales for the 1st quarter equal \$10,772. This far exceeds the anticipated budgeted amount and any other year's total-to-date. We are able to pass some "less than store quality" donations on to others such as Christ Team for recycling. Many still usable items, though well worn or outdated, are delivered to the "Farm Workers Association of Volusia County" in Pierson twice a month by Harriet Rogers. Basically about 7,000 people including 400 children are receiving benefits from our assistance. Thank you to those who bring in donations and encourage your neighbors to do so as well. The snow birds are starting to leave and, as always, we need a few more folks who can spare at least 3 hours per week to "help us help others."


