## Senior Pastor's Message



Have you ever heard the folk tale of Lawn Chair Larry? According to published reports, Larry Walters was employed as a truck driver in Southern California. On July 2, 1982, the 33 year-old man fastened 42 surplus weather balloons he had purchased at the Army/Navy Surplus Store (many years earlier as a teenager) to a Sears lawn chair and launched "Inspiration I"

from his girlfriend Carol's San Pedro home. He carried various supplies with him as well as a BB pistol to shoot balloons one at a time to descend. He planned to float over 300 miles and into the Mojave Desert. He didn't realize how powerful the buoyancy of the balloons was. When he cut a rope holding him to terra firma, he took off with such a jolt that another anchor rope broke under the stress against the roof of the home and he shot upward so quickly that his eyeglasses flew to the ground. He floated around the L.A. basin for some 45 minutes and reached altitudes of up to 16,000 feet. According to an article in the New York Times the next day, Walters was spotted by pilots from both TWA and Delta Airlines. It was cold at 16,000 feet and he started shooting some of his balloons to descend, but dropped his gun and had to wait for his rig to come down on its own. He landed in a residential neighborhood in Long Beach where the chair got tangled in some power lines, causing a 20 minute power blackout. He was fined by the FAA and the utility company, appeared on late night talk shows, was awarded the top prize by the Bonehead Club of Dallas, and set an unofficial record for gas-filled balloon ascents. When asked why he did it, Walters responded, "Well, you can't just sit there."

While I was reading this story recently, I remembered that adage, "We sing 'Standing on the Promises' but more often are 'Sitting on the Premises." What are we doing and where are we going? What are your dreams for us? Are you truly involved in making POUCC stronger and more vital? How well are we doing to make a difference in our community and in the world? I am certainly not advocating such extreme stunts as Larry's but he dared to soar above the clouds. He did what people said could not be done. He pursued his dream (albeit misguided) with a passion and single-minded purpose for many years. Other licensed pilots, inspired by his accomplishment, soared in a similar yet legal way in the years after his flight. As we expand our facilities and programs, to what end are we pursuing? Who are we inspiring to dare to dream and soar? Where would we like to see POUCC in 20-30 years? How can we help to "pave the way" there for those who will come after us?





A very special moment for me last month in the life of our church family was when I met with our youth for a special blessing before their departure to the Florida Conference Youth Retreat in Vero Beach. As always with this remarkable group of kids, the air was bubbling with the excitement of just being together; but this time, they were actually taking a journey together -- both

physically and spiritually. After about ten minutes of them trying to figure a way of all traveling together in the same vehicle, they were finally convinced that was virtually impossible, and it took another ten minutes to figure out who was traveling with whom. Priceless! Oh, to have been with them on the other end for the return trip to witness this juggling act following a weekend of togetherness! But that was not to be.

That was not to be for, as most of you are aware, MY best "buddy" and husband, Tim, became quite ill, was hospitalized and scheduled for cardiac surgery later in the month, so my place was to be home with him. At this writing, surgery is but days away, but I am assured in knowing that God is with us and that all will be well. I thank each of you from the bottom of my heart for your loving support and encouragement throughout this ordeal. If only those without a church family could know what they're missing. What an incredible blessing you all truly are!

Before closing, I want to say a special THANK YOU to Tracy Davis for being a Youth Retreat chaperone, as well as driving Jackie Clough's van (which she so generously loaned us for the weekend) full of energetic kids to and from Vero Beach. Tracy so enjoyed our kids and was so proud of them that he has volunteered to chaperone for the Walk On Water retreat in January which takes place in Miami. Sher Buller also chaperoned on that trip. Get this! Since I was unable to attend the Vero Beach trip, thus not providing the second vehicle necessary, Sher stepped right in and offered to drive even though she was unable to stay the weekend, which meant two round-trips of driving instead of one. Now that's what I'm talking about -- FAMILY! Thanks, Sher!

The girl looked up and smiled and tried to sing along with us. They left with the clothes, smiling and happy. Another customer had been in the store all this time and soon she came to the register with an item she wanted to purchase. I wrapped it for her and told her it was \$2.00. She handed me a \$5.00 bill and when I went to give her the change she gave it back to me saying she had been touched by what happened with the Haitian orphan.

This is just one of the many stories that Thrift Store volunteers can tell and why we love volunteering there. Our store is important to so many people for so many reasons. 
