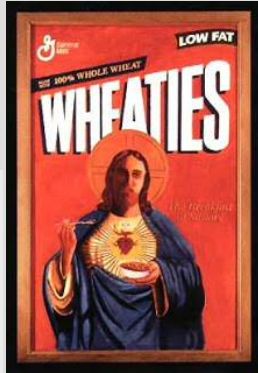

Dear Friends,

In 1922 a guy working for the Washburn Crosby Company, which would later become General Mills, accidentally spilled a wheat bran mixture onto a hot stove and invented Wheaties. By 1926, Wheaties had been perfected and packaged and were being marketed on Minneapolis' WCCO radio station with the first ever commercial jingle:

*Have you tried Wheaties?*

*They are whole wheat with all the bran.*

*Won't you try Wheaties?*

*For wheat is the best food of man.*

In 1927 an advertising agent penned the slogan, "Wheaties... the Breakfast of Champions." And with that slogan on that trademark orange box, Wheaties was an instant success. In 1934 they added the picture of a sports champion on the back or side of the box along with the caption, "The Breakfast of Champions." Baseball's Lou Gehrig was the first. Then came the likes of sprinter Jessie Owens, and there have been hundreds of individuals and teams on the box. In 1958, the picture was moved to the front of the box with Olympic pole vaulter, Bob Richards. Since then, there have been race car drivers like Dale Earnhardt, famous coaches, boxing greats like Muhammad Ali, football greats like Walter Payton, hockey greats like Wayne Gretzky, basketball hero Michael Jordan made the box 18 times and Tiger Woods has made the box 14 times. There have been a host of Olympic champions and sports heroes over the last nearly 70 years. Gender and color barriers were broken by the company. In the sports world, you know you have made it to the big time when you get on the box of Wheaties. The pictures continue to change to appeal to a new generation of sports minded Wheaties eaters. I found out recently that you can pay to have a nice quality photo of yourself on the box of Wheaties suitable for framing...hmmmm. An artist depicted Jesus on the box above – I guess cameras were not very good in his day? No matter who is on the box cover, inside is the same ole Wheaties they cooked up in 1922... the product has never changed but the way they market Wheaties is constantly changing. What does this have to do with us and our church? Everything. We may change and upgrade facilities, staff will come and go, worship and music styles evolve, members move away or move on – the photo or look on the "box" will always be different but we still have the same "product" inside that the world hungers for. And so we continue to take Christ into the world... the packaging changes, the appeal changes, the delivery mechanisms change but the Christ does not change. We are Christians – we represent more than ourselves. The world is still hungry and we are called to welcome them to God's breakfast table – where there is room for everybody.

## ASSISTANT PASTOR



I am a firm believer in praying the news, and we are currently in a global situation which is in serious need of our prayers. Syria's massacre last month of 1,400 of their own citizens, including women and children, was absolutely horrific. A natural and immediate knee-jerk reaction for America was to plan for military retaliation on behalf of the murdered innocents, and to destroy or confiscate all remaining chemical weapons in Syria to prevent this from happening again.

Prayers were lifted by Christians throughout the world as soon as we first learned of this massacre, for OUR knee-jerk reaction was to run to God! We continued to pray as national and world leaders struggled with trying to decide what action would be best. With each passing day, indecision and confusion prevailed. Our President sent warships to the area in support of possible military action, as did England and France. But then the situation escalated when warships from Russia and China appeared in opposition to military retaliation towards Syria. An international time-bomb was set.

Prayers escalated to the point of desperation, but when you pray for God's will to prevail, that feeling of desperation is conquered by the peace that passes all understanding. God's intervention soon began to unfold when Secretary of State John Kerry made an aside suggestion following his News Conference that the only peaceful way to settle this situation in Syria would be for Syria to give up their chemical weapons to a neutral country, but he said that wouldn't happen. Much to our surprise, however, Russia's Vladimir Putin jumped right in and set this peaceful plan into action. Time bomb diffused!

History has made skeptics of us all, so this act on Russia's part of initiating a peaceful solution seems totally out-of-character for that government. But for the moment, we'll take it! Let others worry about the possibility of Russia having unfavorable alternative motives up their sleeves. Let us, as Christians, continue praying that international leaders will allow for God's plan to continue unfolding, even though we may all still be in shock over Russia's leadership in preventing a world-wide disaster.

- **Six Band-Aids**

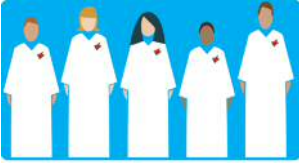

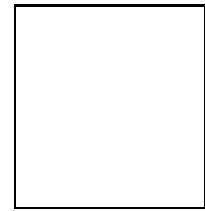

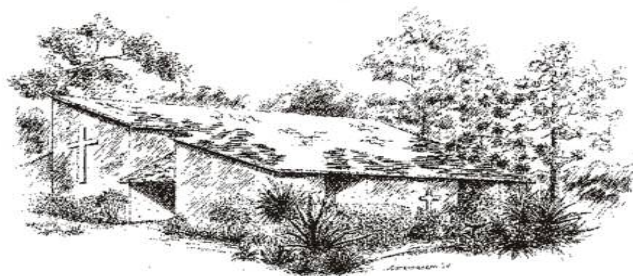
