



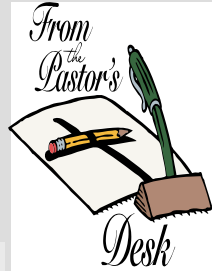

Pastor's Message



Dear Friends,

As I write this article, we mark the 35th Anniversary of the death of Elvis – one of the few we denote by a single name. What comes to your mind when you hear his name? His name reminds me of a major change in my life. In August of 1977, I loaded my worldly possessions into my 1964 and ½ Ford Mustang (yes, there were a few built) and drove to Texas Christian University in Fort Worth to start college. Elvis had died the day before and every radio station was playing his music. For 2 and ½ days and over 1, 200 miles, all I heard was Elvis music! Don't get me wrong, I love Elvis and many of his songs (some of the movies were okay too) but that was overkill –no pun intended. I believe one of the reasons Elvis was (and remains so popular) is not just the vast range of his song choices and subjects but also their honesty and realism. My favorites were his Christmas and Gospel recordings. Recognizing this anniversary, therefore, brings me back many fond and not so fond memories. The trip to college was scary. I had never attempted something so big on my own. I was apprehensive about what the future might hold and recognized - as much as I could for an 18 year old who really knew very little although that was not apparent at the time – that this was a life changing moment. Over the past 35 years, I have experienced many other life changing moments – some welcome and some most unwelcome alike – I'm sure you all have experienced the same in your lives. Life is about change and how we handle it – whether we can be proactive to plan ahead or how we will respond when it is unexpected and unwelcome.

Now is a time for change here at Port Orange United Church of Christ. We are welcoming new members, saying goodbye to some beloved members, clearing the west property for development, repairing and enhancing our sound and video capabilities in the sanctuary, creating new staff positions, embracing some new ideas about what it means to be a church, and choosing to embrace a bolder future as a community of faith. Change is never totally welcomed – unless you're a baby with a dirty diaper! Still, I am proud of your faithfulness and your support. These are trying times for all churches. We are challenged like we have not been for many years to be inclusive, relevant and meaningful to people who are struggling in their own everyday lives. The church must change, adapt, and truly serve more than its' own needs or it will die. To borrow a song title – "It's Now or Never" – such is the case facing most churches in this time of economic, social, and political uncertainty. Some may be tempted to sing "Don't be Cruel" or "Hound Dog" but we strive for the One whose Love and Mercy are "Always on my Mind" even when we're "All Shook Up."

Our income is above what we expected thanks mostly to our wonderful Thrift Store. Unfortunately, we have had extra expenses that weren't budgeted. The largest over expenditure is in the building maintenance category. The new toilets plus installation were \$801.19. The lights and ballasts in the Sanctuary were \$1,854.23 with labor and removal of rats/squirrels over the Charles Mix addition was \$1,640. Hopefully, we will be back on track over the next few months. *Respectfully submitted, Susie Greiff, Treasurer*

Another meeting with Nateco was held at Covenant United Methodist Church to see a system done by Nateco. We hope to have some definitive plans and costs to present to the Council this fall. 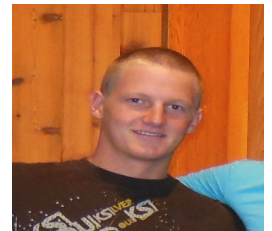

THE GIFT & THRIFT STORE

HIGHLIGHTS AND HISTORY OF THE THRIFT AND GIFT STORE

July 20, 1999 The “Thrift Shop” opened thanks to the idea from Roberta Sparks and Gracye Beeman and to the 1999 Church Officers and Rev. Bill Mulford for their willingness to try something new. Gracye worked with the city staff for permits etc. and we began with: one room for sales, one room for donations, 9 volunteers, one set of old shelving, rescued from a dumpster, and minimal cash loaned by Gracye. The first deposit was \$16.00 but we were on the way! Gracie was repaid and the original shelving, sanded and painted by co-managers Sandy Deardorff and Barb Pountain, still serves us well to this day. By the end of the year, regular hours of operation began, three 4-hour days per week.

2000 Jackie Gaither contributed funding for Penny Saver advertising and Jack Rogers made regular trips to the dump for the Church and store. Bill Fried donated a large display rack. The second room was opened up by Bob Hance using his carpentry skills. The shed was cleaned out, shelving added and designated for our use.

2001 Bill Heffner, Jack Hilgenberg and Ric painted both rooms. Thanks to Jeanette (the organizer) and Fred (the navigator) we began to pick up donations after the Cypress Head yearly sale. Carlene and Jack Rogers, Ric & Barb Pountain, Jack Hilgenberg and the Campbell's formed the “pick up” team.

2002 A three-day, Mid-Summer Rummage and Bake Sale took place in July sponsored by the Women's Fellowship and the Thrift Store volunteers. “Sheriff” Russ and Elaine Howe kept us organized and began listing and selling some donated items on E-Bay. Jeanette Campbell joined Barb as co-manager and the price, per piece, for adult clothing went up to \$2.00 and remains that today.

2003 Lois Winsemius donated her time and talent to make a large banner and “Thrift Store Open” flag. Bob Hance and Jack Rogers re-configured the AC/heat system and installed new thermostats. New garment racks started to appear thanks to Ric and he quickly became an expert at assembly.

2004 Carol Rogers assumed the role of co-manager and along with Jeanette took us through a rough hurricane season including repair and clean-up time. Joe Rogers played a big part in ceiling and roof repairs as well.

2005 By this year we were sending 10-20 bags of clothing to Christ Team as well as holding regular bag sales at \$5.00 each. Additional volunteers continued to step forward to help with day-to-day operations as hours were extended.

2006 Two more rooms were added thanks to Bob Hance and his presentation to the Church Council. Bob Brewster, with assistance from Ric Pountain and Jack Hilgenberg transformed the area for a total cost of \$90.00. We are indeed blessed with talented workers. Doris' Circle donated funds to purchase four more garment racks and the store funded three more.

2007 We continue to assist ten to twelve missions directly from donations as well as support Missions Committee projects. This could not happen without the many volunteers, members and shoppers who donate new and nearly new items. We are now open 9:00 to 3:00 four days per week and 9:00-Noon on Saturday.

2008 A total of 35 volunteers now make up the team and we are a six days per week operation. At no cost to the Church, all shelving units in the first room were replaced with new, white units that really brought the room to life!!!

Over the years, an astonishing number of 77 people have served or are still actively involved with the mission of the Gift and Thrift Store. As I have stated many times, one of the often heard compliments about the store is that the volunteers are all friendly, cheerful and helpful. Without them we would not have a clean, tidy, and successful store.

From the humble beginnings - The Store has achieved the total income of \$345,637.50, through July 2012, plus outstanding service to our community, our Church and Missions.

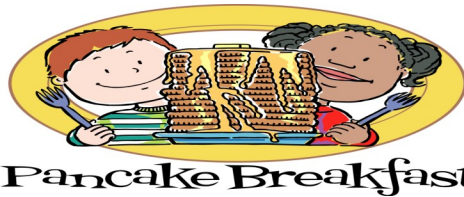
PLEASE HELP: Mission Boxes are located throughout the building. Please remember your gift goes a long way in helping so many who are in such great need.

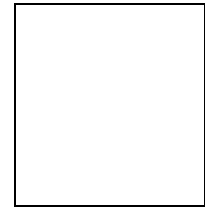

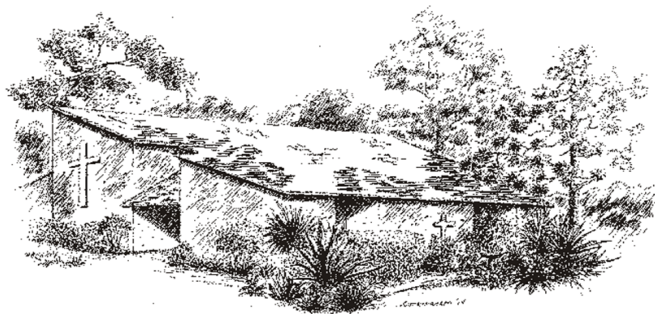
